

DRIVING A PROGRESSIVE SAFETY CULTURE

This unwavering commitment has been pivotal in our successful achievement of Certificate of Recognition (COR) certification from WorkSafeBC by the end of 2023.

Achieving COR certification was a long standing goal for TNDC, although the initial work that went into preparing for the first external audit was only the beginning of our journey. Now we are tasked with maintaining the systems and processes we put in place that allow us to proudly demonstrate our proactive role in occupational health and safety. TNDC will conduct its first internal COR audit in October 2024.

LEADING THE WAY IN SAFETY DEVELOPMENT & TRAINING

Continuous investment in leadership development and training has been integral to TNDC's growth. We take great pride in having two dedicated Tahltan heavy equipment trainers stationed at our Red Chris project site. They are tasked with facilitating heavy equipment training, orientations, standard operating procedure reviews, and verification of competency assessments to ensure the highest standards are met.

Throughout the first quarter of 2024, our trainers adeptly conducted over 90 verification of competency assessments and carried out 170 standard operating procedure reviews. Their hands-on coaching and mentoring approach has proven instrumental in nurturing strong relationships and fostering an environment that encourages open dialogue, constructive discussion, and positive communication among workers.

FOSTERING A SAFE & RESPECTFUL WORKPLACE

Addressing bullying and harassment in the workplace has been a key focus area for TNDC. We are dedicated to creating and maintaining a workplace ambiance devoid of bullying and harassment. Company-wide training was conducted to ensure all supervisors and workers are knowledgeable on the regulatory requirements pertaining to identifying, mitigating and addressing bullying and harassment in the workplace. Our participation in the annual Pink Shirt Day campaign further reinforces our commitment to a safe, respectful, inclusive workplace.



EXPANDING INJURY MANAGEMENT SUPPORT

Over the past 16 months, TNDC has made injury management a top priority. We have developed a comprehensive return-to-work program that goes beyond the requirements outlined by WorkSafeBC, ensuring that workers who sustain work-related injuries receive the highest quality care available.

In early 2023, TNDC partnered with Total Physio to offer virtual physiotherapy assessments and access to resources aimed at identifying injuries and providing recommendations for preventative strategies and treatment. Expanding on this initiative, the first quarter of 2024 saw the introduction of Total Medical Remote Doctor Services to our injury management program. This service provides quick and efficient access to remote medical doctor advice, specializing in occupational-related injuries. Collaborating closely with the physiotherapy teams at Total Physio, these doctors help create return-towork plans following an injury.



INTEGRATING HEALTH & SAFETY PROGRAMS

At our Red Chris site, amid the ongoing transition with Newmont, TNDC has been actively involved in their training programs to ensure compliance, comprehension, and utilization of their PSM (pre-start meeting) and FRM (fatality risk management) initiatives. TNDC eagerly anticipates the implementation of these programs, which are designed to elevate site safety and foster worker engagement in identifying and mitigating hazards that could lead to workplace fatalities. All TNDC supervisors, project managers, and leadership based at the site have undergone training and collaborate closely with our client representatives to optimize the overall effectiveness of these programs.

The TNDC Mobile Training Centre is a 44-foot trailer designed for training purposes. It houses four simulators, each with its own unique operator training program including articulated trucks, dozers and loaders, excavators, and another program in development.




MOVING FROM REVIEW TO AUDIT

As we strive to fulfill our mission of running a diverse and profitable corporate entity that fosters economic prosperity for a self-reliant Tahltan Nation, our Partnerships and Business Development team, dedicated to sustainable development, holds a crucial position. Business partnerships continue to be a cornerstone of

TNDC's activities and expansion efforts.

Although TNDC strives to self-perform most of its work, collaboration with partners is essential to support scopes where we lack experience or specialized equipment. These partnerships enable TNDC to expand its service offerings, deliver additional products, and enhance its capabilities progressively.

ACHIEVEMENT HIGHLIGHTS

We have reached a notable milestone: TNDC now holds an impressive portfolio of 32 active partnerships, each poised to drive community prosperity by securing revenue, workforce empowerment, supporting private Tahltan businesses, and increasing community resources through monetary or in-kind donations.

Our collective efforts have yielded approximately \$10.5 million in revenue, underpinning our role as a cornerstone of economic vitality in the region. This financial achievement complements our commitment to the community, with partnership employment peaking at 82 Tahltan members during the 2023 summer season and 54 in winter. This compares favourably to the Brucejack and Red Chris Mines, which directly employ between 150-200 Tahltans.

Our focus on optimizing agreements has led to the modernization of seven partnership contracts. These enhancements aim to improve accountability and financial terms, ensuring maximum returns for our company and aligning with our strategic goals. Additionally, the creation of three new partnerships — with a concrete company, an aggregate producer, and a health and safety firm — reflects our proactive approach to diversifying and strengthening our economic landscape.

The Partnership Management Program remains a sophisticated engine, designed to amplify our nation's prosperity through employment maximization, revenue optimization, support for Tahltan businesses in the TNDC supply chain, and increasing community resources via strategic donations. →



In 2024, we are focused on optimizing economic opportunities that support the well-being of the Tahltan Nation. We are committed to driving value by enhancing our current partnerships and evolving our business model beyond revenue-sharing to secure equity opportunities.

Tahltan Communications

Tahltan Communications – a partnership between Tahltan Nation Development Corporation (TNDC) and CityWest Cable and Telephone Corporation (CityWest) – has reached another exciting milestone in bringing high speed telecommunications services over fibre optics into Tahltan Territory.

Following the completion of the network backbone build last fall, Tahltan Communications has begun providing high-speed connectivity to clients within Tahltan Territory. Industrial clients such as Brucejack Mine, Red Chris Mine and the Coast Mountain Hydro Facility are all receiving improved connectivity through the newly built fibre-optic network.

CityWest teams are in the process of closing agreements with multiple anchor tenants (schools, Band offices and firehalls) in Iskut and Dease Lake. Installations will soon take place to bring these clients online with faster, more reliable Internet services. We encourage eligible anchor tenants to reach out to CityWest and take advantage of the new fibre-optic services.

Later this year, construction teams will continue to expand our fibre-optic network into Dease Lake and Iskut, to homes and other businesses, setting the stage for improved connectivity across the region.

This state-of-the-art fibre-optic network will bring significant benefits to Tahltan Territory, improving the delivery of healthcare, safety, education and social services and fostering economic development, environmental protection and infrastructure development.

4.1.2

Tahltan Forestry

Tahltan Forestry Ltd. (TFL) is a joint company owned by TNDC and NorthPac Forestry Group Ltd. TFL was founded in late 2019 to manage all forestry-related activities in Tahltan Territory.

TFL has two main streams of activity: traditional logging and forestry work for mines and utilities. Notably, in the 2023 fiscal year, the forestry business recorded a pre-tax profit of \$1 million.

Traditional Logging

Tahltan Forestry sustainably harvested and delivered approximately 85,000 m³ from the Bob Quinn area. A mix of hemlock, balsam, spruce and pine were harvested and delivered to various locations within northwest BC. As well, with the help of Wild Timber Industries, a Tahltan subcontractor, Tahltan Forestry was able to deliver two loads of firewood to each of the three Tahltan communities. Tahltan Forestry will be working to steadily increase the deliveries of firewood from the operations throughout 2024.

Tahltan Forestry also began working with the Ministry of Forests to tackle the bark beetle epidemic in the southern part of Tahltan Territory. Pheromone traps were set this past summer to attract nearby beetles into concentrated pockets within the area to reduce their spread into other healthy stands.

Tahltan Forestry is now harvesting the infected trees where the traps were set, and removing the dead standing trees that were infected in previous years. This has the added benefit of reducing wildfire risk. It is difficult for the average person to recognize recently infected trees (referred to as "green attack") from a distance, but the standing dead trees can easily be identified by their red and grey needles. Tahltan Forestry will continue to tackle the epidemic in the Bob Quinn area to the best of our ability.

Mining Work

On the mining side, Tahltan Forestry successfully completed a tree clearing contract at the KSM Project. With the support of Wild Timber Industries and other Tahltan suppliers, Tahltan Forestry cleared a significant section of the powerline right-of-way for KSM.

In addition, Tahltan Forestry recovered several thousand cubic metres of sawlogs that were left behind from the clearing of the KSM road and delivered them to sawmills. This project was a great success and was able to be completed just before the Christmas shutdown at site. Tahltan Forestry is grateful for the opportunity to work at KSM and feels very fortunate to have been able to work with some excellent Tahltan contractors and employees this past year.



Becoming a leading transportation solutions provider in B.C.'s Golden Triangle

In Spring, TNDC and Central Mountain Air announced expansion of their partnership through the joint branding of an aircraft and the addition of new planes to CMA's fleet. TNDC and CMA are focused on delivering air transportation services for Newmont's Red Chris mine crews through the Dease Lake Airport.

The joint branded aircraft is a brand new De Havilland Dash-8 400 where branding of the aircraft features distinctive elements representing the unique partnership between the two organizations. Designed for efficiency and comfort, the Dash-8 400 aircraft is the highest-capacity turboprop on the market with a seating capacity of 76 passengers. It is renowned for its reliability, speed, and versatility, equipped with advanced technology and spacious seating. Additional aircraft will be delivered in spring 2024.

Aviation Services Division

Revolutionizing Airport Operations: A Beacon of Growth and Innovation

TNDC's Aviation Services Division remains a pivotal element of our overarching strategy, driving growth, innovation and community development, as we continue to elevate the standards of airport operations in Tahltan Territory.

Since its inception in March 2020, this strategic division has swiftly evolved from serving the initial contract with Newcrest Mining (former Red Chris Mine operator) to managing the Dease Lake Airport (CYDL) under an agreement with the Stikine Airport Society.

This strategic expansion into TNDC Aviation Services has not only diversified TNDC's portfolio but also bolstered local employment opportunities for the Tahltan community, marking a significant stride in our growth journey.



Key Milestones and Developments

RECRUITMENT SUCCESS

Focussed on enriching the local workforce, all positions within the division are currently filled. Specialized roles in aircraft refueling and firefighting are being staffed temporarily by bringing the expertise into the territory, rather than permanent relocation (fly in, fly out). This strategy lays the groundwork to ultimately transfer our training and fill these positions from the local workforce, underlining our commitment to community development.



ENHANCED TRAINING & DEVELOPMENT

In line with this strategy is the engagement of Executive Flight Centre (EFC) to manage our airport operations, enhance our capacity and build the skillset of our workforce. Our comprehensive training initiatives have evolved to prioritize knowledge transfer and continuous improvement across various domains including supervisor leadership, health, safety, and environment (HSE), and emergency services. Seasonal training ensures our team is well prepared for specific operational requirements, such as aircraft de/anti-icing and crash fire rescue.



FLEET & MAINTENANCE EXCELLENCE

With significant improvements in fleet management, including the acquisition of additional critical equipment and a dedicated full-time mechanic, our operational readiness, especially during winter, has seen remarkable enhancement. We also continued the application of our refreshed brand to our airport equipment, including fuel truck and baggage carts. →

IMPROVING SAFETY, FOSTERING COMMUNITY WELLNESS

In April, Stikine Airport Authority, in partnership with TNDC and the Tahltan Band, announced substantial funding to implement advanced perimeter fencing. A 6-foot chain-link fence with the option of adding 18 inches of barbed wire on top will be installed around the perimeter of the Dease Lake Airport.

This represents an upgrade from the deteriorating 3 to 4 foot wooden and barbed wire fencing currently present on the north side and the absence of fencing on the south side; animals currently have easy access to the runway from the south (resulting in incidents) or get entangled in the barbed wire on the north side.

The pathway will serve recreational purposes, accommodating activities such as snowmobiling, ATV riding, walking, jogging, and biking, along a roughly 3.4 km route encircling the airport.


SERVICE EXPANSION


Collaborations with the Stikine Airport Society (SAS) have led to notable infrastructure improvements, such as the procurement of a sprung structure building for equipment storage and the installation of a new septic system, significantly boosting our operational efficiency. In April, we announced receipt of \$918,652 in funding from the BC Air Access Program (BCAAP), to implement advanced perimeter fencing and to create a designated recreational pathway around the perimeter of the Dease Lake Airport. Our team has worked directly with onsite clients and at our clients' Vancouver offices to ensure their upcoming needs are met. Notably, our ongoing tendering efforts underscore our ambitious outlook, with several significant projects in the pipeline.

STANDARDIZATION AS OUR CORNERSTONE

Central to our strategic endeavors is our standardized estimating process. This vital strategy not only boosts our competitive advantage but also opens new avenues for securing projects, contributing to our long-term growth. The synergy between our Pre-Construction/Estimating and Construction teams ensures a smooth transition from proposal development to project execution. This effective flow of information is crucial for delivering projects safely, on time, and within budget.

As part of our continuous improvement commitment, these processes have been documented in the TNDC Operations Manual, establishing a robust framework that enables us to consistently secure and execute projects, reinforcing our industry position.

VICTORIES & MILESTONES

This period also strengthened our relationships with key clients. Recent wins, such as the extension of the Master Service Agreements (MSA) with Newmont at Red Chris and a new MSA with Skeena Resources for the Eskay Creek Revitalization Project, are a testament to our strategic foresight and operational excellence. →

This effort has proven successful with TNDC being awarded scopes of work for Road Maintenance and On-Site Construction Support Works with Skeena. In addition to the TIA (tailings impoundment area) Winter Works, Red Chris Block Cave Winter Earthworks and 2024 TIA Construction, we have also been awarded the Vent Raise 2 & 3, 1 – Surface Earthworks and Naghā ROM (run of mine) Pad Surface Works at Red Chris. These accomplishments not only bolster our project portfolio but also lay a solid foundation for future ventures.

STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIPS

While TNDC aims to self-perform the majority of its work, it's important we work with our partners to support scopes where we may not have the experience or specialized equipment to self-perform. These partner relationships allow TNDC to offer additional services and products, and grow our capabilities over time. To this point, TNDC has been working with Kode Contracting on aggregate supply scopes, and bulk hauling with Pelly Construction for certain aspects of TIA Construction, along with other construction partners.

FORWARD MOMENTUM

TNDC's 2024 construction season is in full swing.
Dedicated efforts at strategic diversification is
geared towards smoothing out the seasonal peaks
and valleys that have historically marked our
sector, setting the stage for a year of unparalleled

Our proactive bidding and proposal strategies placed us at the forefront of securing pivotal projects across a spectrum of clients, including Newmont (Red Chris mine), Skeena Resources (Eskay Creek), Seabridge (KSM Project) and negotiations with Galore Creek Mining Corporation (Galore Creek).

Our ongoing tendering efforts underscore our ambitious outlook. In addition to several significant project proposals in the submission pipeline, we have identified an equal number of opportunities and have also been successful in several submissions for contracts at Red Chris and Skeena.

OVERCOMING RECRUITMENT CHALLENGES



Aggregates Division

Strategic Diversification Supporting the Pre-Eminent Industry

The TNDC Aggregates Division has continued to mature, becoming a fundamental part of TNDC's operations, supporting both self-performance and client needs. We have secured standing orders for aggregates for the 2024 season, which will help build a strong foundation for the division's future.



TNDC Aggregates, including sand, gravel and crushed rock, was launched in 2023, with the goal to be the main rock and aggregate supplier in Tahltan Territory. Aggregates are a most basic element in the construction of buildings, roads, dams, and other infrastructure as a base material or in composite material such as concrete.

The demand for aggregates suitable for concrete production is high, and TNDC is conducting exploratory works to identify sources that meet these criteria. This will enable us to diversify our client base and offer cost-effective solutions for other developments in the territory.

Eskay Operations

→ KM43: TNDC acquired an Occupant License to Cut (OLTC) and a Notice of Work (NOW) in the first months of 2024 and is well on its way to producing an estimated 30,000 tonnes of product from this gravel pit in 2024.

Southern Operations

→ Poleyard West: TNDC, KSM and various consultants and partners (including Allnorth) have been working to develop aggregate sources that meet the needs of the current and proposed projects in the southern portion of the territory.

Northern Operations

→ Red Chris: TNDC, in collaboration with Kode
Contracting, provided crushed aggregates for
the TIA, Site Services, and Block Cave over the
winter season. These aggregates were used to
support winter operations, and in preparation
for the 2024 construction season. TNDC is also
negotiating a multi-year services agreement
with Red Chris to supply aggregate crushing
and washing services through 2026.

Through the adoption of robust "Preventative Maintenance" practices, encompassing regular inspections and timely repairs, we have significantly reduced the occurrence of unscheduled repairs. This proactive approach not only preserves the integrity of our assets but also ensures our projects progress without delays, underpinned by the unparalleled dedication of our tradespeople.

SUPPLIES & PURCHASING

Managing an expansive fleet of over 300 pieces of equipment is no small feat. It demands exceptional organizational prowess and the strategic use of our Maintenance/Warehouse and Purchasing software systems. The past year has seen us harness a wealth of data from repair work orders and purchasing orders (POs) to optimize our stock levels, ensuring we are always equipped to maintain our fleet effectively. This data-driven strategy guarantees we are never caught off guard by low stock levels, ensuring the continuity of our operations.





MANAGING WORKLOAD

The current year is poised to be one of the busiest in TNDC's history, challenging us to manage an unprecedented workload.

From heavy equipment repair at Red Chris to operations at our Dease Lake Shop and the Airport, our team is efficiently closing over 150 Work Orders weekly and processing 150 POs monthly for parts and supplies. Despite the growing demands, our staff of mechanics and welders has been steadfast, supported by an increase in our Lube/Fuel personnel who have now become chargeable positions. Moreover, our collaboration with clients to implement a "Pressure Washing" crew is a testament to our commitment to maintaining our fleet's cleanliness and operational efficiency, reinforcing our status as the "Contractor of Choice."

PERSONAL IMPROVEMENT & TRAINING

Ongoing training is fundamental to fostering a safe and proficient workforce. Our commitment to personal improvement is evident in our comprehensive training programs, from Verification of Competencies and Standard Operating Procedures for all new staff to advanced equipment operation skills for our junior staff. By leveraging a variety of on-site training opportunities, including working from heights and propane filling, we ensure our team is well equipped to meet the demands of the job.

This year, we have taken significant steps by promoting one of our apprentice mechanics to manage a service truck, providing them with invaluable hands-on experience. Additionally, the recruitment of experienced Red Seal Heavy Duty Technicians to lead our operations at Red Chris and Dease Lake Shop further strengthens our operational capabilities.



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Treaty Creek Limited Partnership Update

Strategic Partnership optimizing participation to KSM Project

The Treaty Creek Limited Partnership (TCLP) is a partnership between the Tahltan Nation Development Corporation and the Nisga'a Growth Corporation.

This partnership brings new life to a centuries-old Peace Treaty through the Treaty Creek Partnership, which is optimizing participation at the Seabridge KSM project.

2023 SERVICE CONTRACTS

It was a successful first year for the new TCLP, which saw total revenues exceeding \$1 million, as well as several partnerships established and service contracts awarded.

Highlights include:

- → Rotary air services switched from TNDC-Alpine to TCLP-Alpine early in 2023.
- → Medical services shifted to TCLP-International SOS, who have subcontracted about 40% of the work to a Nisga'a Nation member-owned company.

50 TAHLTAN & NISGA'A NATION MEMBERS EMPLOYED

Did you know that over 50 Tahltan and Nisga'a Nation members were employed at the KSM Seabridge project in 2023, serving in roles related to medical, security, forestry, environmental, and construction services?

- → Site services and environmental monitoring work was done by Tahltan and Nisga'a Nation member owned businesses.
- → Roadwork and fish habitat construction was undertaken by TCLP-Lemare.
- → Security services have been provided by TCLP-Scarlet Security, with a Nisga'a Nation member-owned company subcontracted for portions of the work.
- → Powerline construction costing was completed with two proponents that involved TCLP for potential partnering opportunities. We will learn the winning bid when construction proceeds in future.

2024 SERVICE WORK

TCLP is actively pursuing all site services work that may be available on the KSM Project. A number of service works and contracts have been identified that TCLP will be pursuing, including Camp Services, Drilling and Civil Works.

Highlights include:

- → Camp services and catering switched to TCLP-ESS Compass Group in January.
- → Geotechnical drilling in 2024 has not been confirmed, but if drilling proceeds portions of the work could be undertaken by TCLP-Geotech.
- → Seabridge are in discussions with BC Hydro about undertaking further Treaty Creek substation civil works through TCLP-FMI or TNDC-Jim Dent Construction.
- → TCLP involvement with Security, Medical and Catering services are anticipated to remain at about the same levels as 2023.

TRAINING INITIATIVES

ESS Compass 2024 Tahltan / Nisga'a Training Program

Camp services training initiatives are scheduled in the upcoming months for Tahltan and Nisga'a members in Northwest BC in Terrace. The training will focus on chef, prep cook, server, and camp attendant positions, with the goal of facilitating job placements upon completion.

Our thanks as well to the group of Tahltan young adults for their support in event execution, as well as members of the TCG team for their contributions in the planning and execution of this signature event.




